

**DISTRICT 13 PUBLIC WORKS INTEGRATING COMMITTEE
PROJECT SELECTION METHODOLOGY

THE STATE CAPITAL IMPROVEMENT PROGRAM**

Application Process and District Policies

Formal applications are completed by the local subdivision and submitted to the District 13 Public Works Executive Committee Member representing their County. The submission date to the County Committee Member representative is **October 5, 2021**. The County Executive Committee Member reviews the applications for completeness and advises the subdivisions of deficiencies.

The County Executive Committee member forwards all applications submitted to the District 13 Integrating Committee Chairman. The Chairman reviews all applications for completeness and proper supporting documentation and scores each project per the District 13 scoring criteria. Applicants are ranked and rated in accordance with the District rating criteria. The OPWC executive committee meets and evaluates the applications and adds the local priority score to determine the proposed project funding list. The district chairman contacts subdivisions whose applications are deficient to request the needed information.

The Integrating Committee receives the Executive Committee's selection and ranking of projects and affirms, amends, or changes the recommendation for funding of projects and forwards those recommendations to the OPWC. The highest-ranking projects are approved for funding until the available district funds are exhausted.

Those projects that qualify for the Small Governments fund, (subdivisions with population of 5,000 or less), and did not earn points high enough for funding from the District, will then be placed in order by the Small Government Committee utilizing the following general criteria: broad county representation within the District, OEPA Findings & Orders and rankings through the District Criteria. The 5 projects will be forwarded on to the Small Governments committee. This process of project selection and evaluation follows the guidelines of OPWC and is consistent with the "anti-dumping policy" of the Small Governments Commission in that all projects are first considered for funding from the District Allocation moneys.

Applicants should consult the OPWC website for complete application instructions and required attachments, application form, and District 13 members and methodology.

APPENDIX B

DISTRICT 13 POLICIES

- District 13 Meetings are subject to open meeting laws as defined by ORC 121.22 and therefore all Integrating and Executive Committee meetings are open to the public at all times.
- District 13 does not allow SCIP/LTIP funds to be applied to preliminary design, final design or construction administration. Applications submitting such cost will deem the project ineligible.
- Projects submitted for Small Government funds may include engineering cost.
- Cost overrun will be bore entirely by the local sponsoring jurisdiction.
- Alley paving and ditch maintenance are ineligible cost.
- Project must proceed within the scope submitted and approved by the Integrating Committee. Work conditions that prevent the construction as described in the original submitted application cannot be altered without Integrating Committee approval.
- General fund, proprietary revenues, state, federal grants or loans directed or used by the local political subdivision for payment of items within the scope of the project are recognized as local match. SCIP or SIB funds borrowed for the project are also recognized as local match.
- Terms of SCIP loans are 0% interest for a term of no more than 30 years, not to exceed the weighted useful life of the project.
- District 13 relies on a liaison to administrate the District's scoring and manage its administrative affairs.
- Applicants vying for scoring advantages for EPA mandates must include a copy of the EPA finding and orders, permit stipulations or consent orders as part of the submission.
- Small Government applications are required to submit self-scoring utilizing the evaluation criteria of the Small Government Program Methodology as an attachment to their application.
- Cost of right-of-way acquisitions required by the improvement project is allowable.
- Minimum match for SCIP grant is 10%. Maximum SCIP grant for new/expansion construction is 50%. LTIP projects require no match.
- District 13 will require all application submitted to OPWC to be accompanied by a hard copy to the county representative, the District 13 liaison and chairman to be deemed valid for rating and inclusive with the annual slate of approved project.
